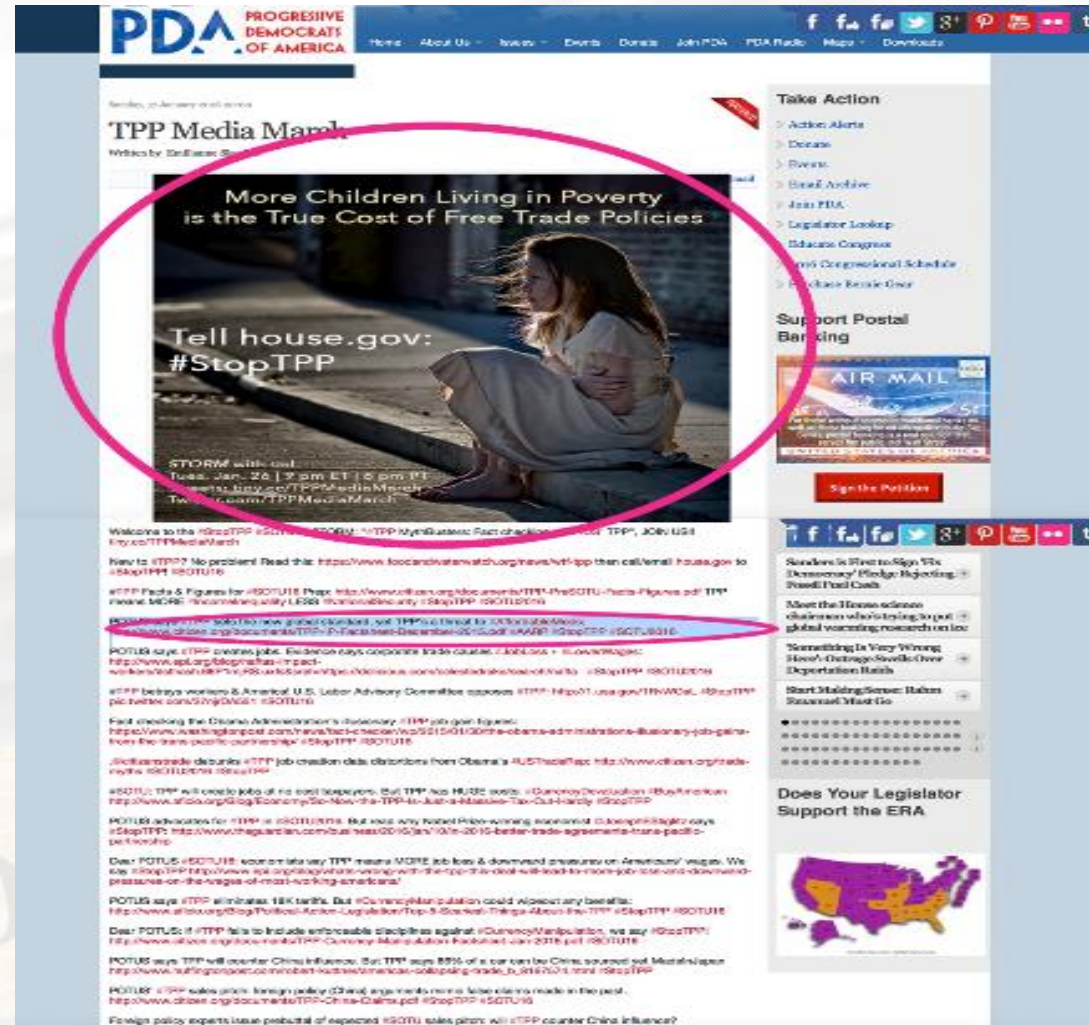

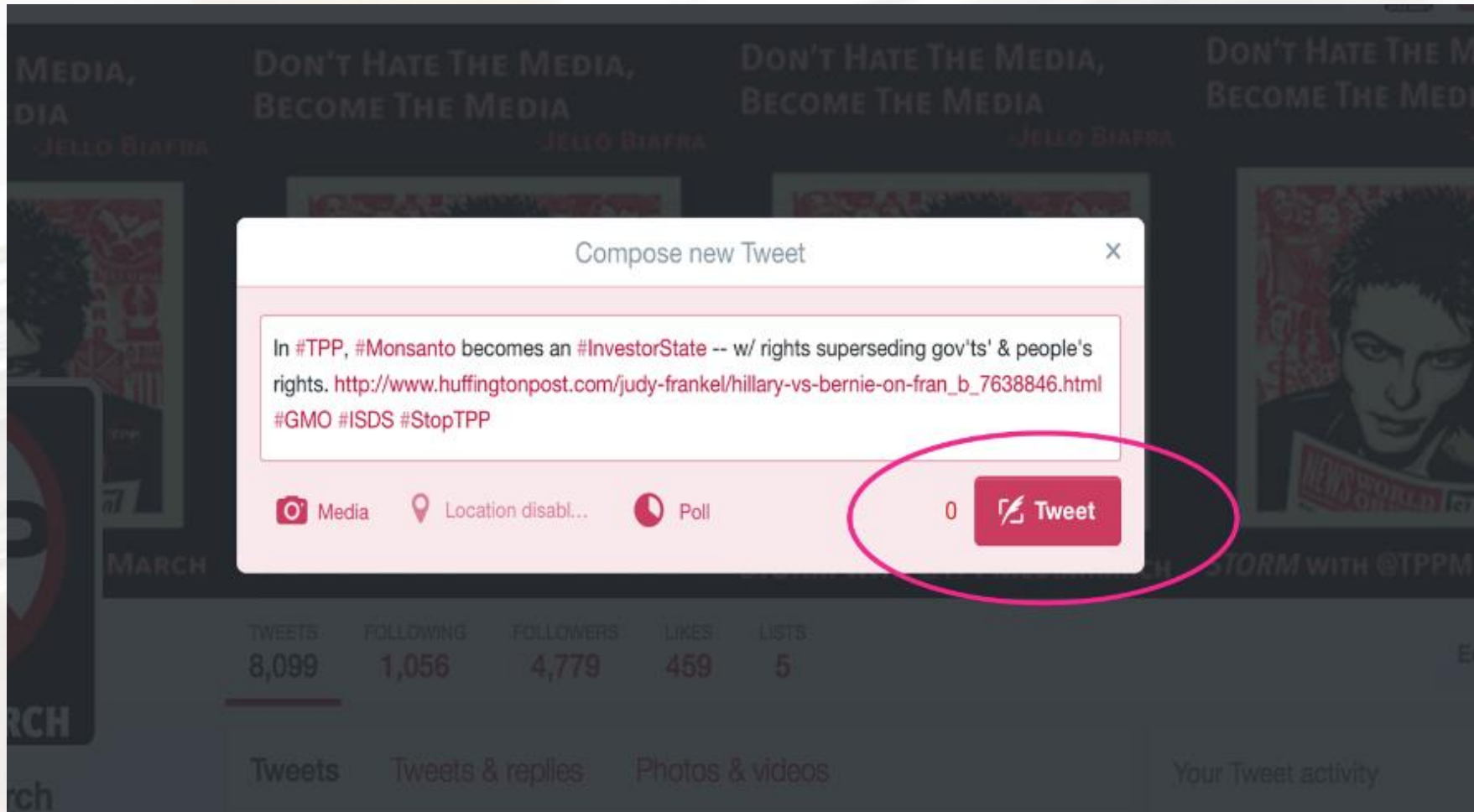



Sharon Anglin Treat is a lawyer and former Maine legislator, where she served 11 terms holding leadership positions including Senate Majority Leader, chairing many committees including the Environment and Natural Resources and Health and Human Services Committees. Treat is a member of the Intergovernmental Policy Advisory Committee (IGPAC) in the Office of the US Trade Representative and of the Maine Citizen Trade Policy Commission, which she chaired in 2013-14.

Sharon Treat has presented several times to negotiators of the TPP and TTIP on access to health care, tobacco policy, and environmental protections, and has represented the Maine Citizen Trade Policy Commission in hearings held by USTR on TTIP and on intellectual property and pharmaceuticals.

Ms. Treat has practiced law with the Natural Resources Council of Maine, as well as in state government and private practice, has taught environmental law and toxic torts at several colleges and at the University of Maine Law School. She has an A. B. degree from Princeton University's Woodrow Wilson School of Public and International Affairs and graduated with honors from Georgetown University Law Center.

Recent Trade Deals

- The Trans-Pacific Partnership (TPP), a 12-nation deal encompassing 40 percent of the world's economy – *now pending in Congress*
- The Trans-Atlantic Trade and Investment Partnership (known as TAFTA or TTIP), between the United States and the European Union (28 countries), the largest bilateral trade deal ever – *still being negotiated*

What is Regulatory Coherence and Cooperation?

US Definition:



“... promoting transparency in the development and implementation of regulations and good regulatory practices, establishing mechanisms for future progress, and pursuing regulatory cooperation initiatives where appropriate... also includes evidence-based analysis and decision-making, and a whole-of-government approach to regulatory management.”

What is Regulatory Cooperation?

“A surreal institutionalisation of lobbying”



- The goal: reducing regulatory “divergences” between EU and US
- The procedures and structures being championed will as a matter of fact increase avenues for foreign corporate lobbies to make their concerns on regulation heard via the institutional channels provided by TTIP
- A “scandalously wide scope:” extension to all sectors, including those excluded from TTIP
- Would apply not only to central EU and federal US govts but also EU members states and US states

TTIP's Regulatory Cooperation Body

- Early warning system for proposed legislation
- Harmonization discussions
- Foreign gov't and corporate influence
- Trade impact and cost-benefit analysis
- Goal: "least trade restrictive" option (including no regulation) & industry-influenced international standards

“Regulatory Compatibility” Really Means... *Deregulation*

- **GOAL:** “Reduce unnecessarily burdensome, duplicative or divergent regulatory requirements affecting trade or investment” *through simplification, harmonization, mutual recognition, equivalence*
- **THINK:** Volkswagen!!
- **REGULATORY EXCHANGES** between EU & U.S. “*Each point of substance raised by one Party shall be addressed and answered by the other Party*”
- **What is being harmonized?** EU central gov’t and U.S. federal gov’t standards



Look who's at the table lobbying for these trade agreements... the same business groups will be at the regulatory cooperation table, and openly state their interest in using TPP and TTIP to thwart state regulations

TPP's REGULATORY COHERENCE CHAPTER

REGULATORY IMPACT ASSESSMENTS

- **assess the need** for a regulatory proposal
- examine feasible **alternatives, their costs and benefits**
- explain how selected alternative **achieves policy objectives in efficient manner**, including, if appropriate, reference to costs and benefits and the potential for managing risks
- rely on best reasonably obtainable existing information including relevant **scientific, technical, economic or other information**, within the boundaries of the authorities, mandates and resources of the particular regulatory agency

IMPACT ASSESSMENTS— A ONE WAY DOWNWARD RATCHET

- Cost-benefit and trade impact assessments can override legislation's mission and language – cost and trade factors central to social, health legislation
- Discounting future health & environmental consequences overemphasizes compliance costs and devalues benefits
- Lack of data undervalues health & environmental impacts
- Industry control of compliance data and public's lack of access to “confidential business information” exaggerates costs

TPP's REGULATORY COHERENCE CHAPTER

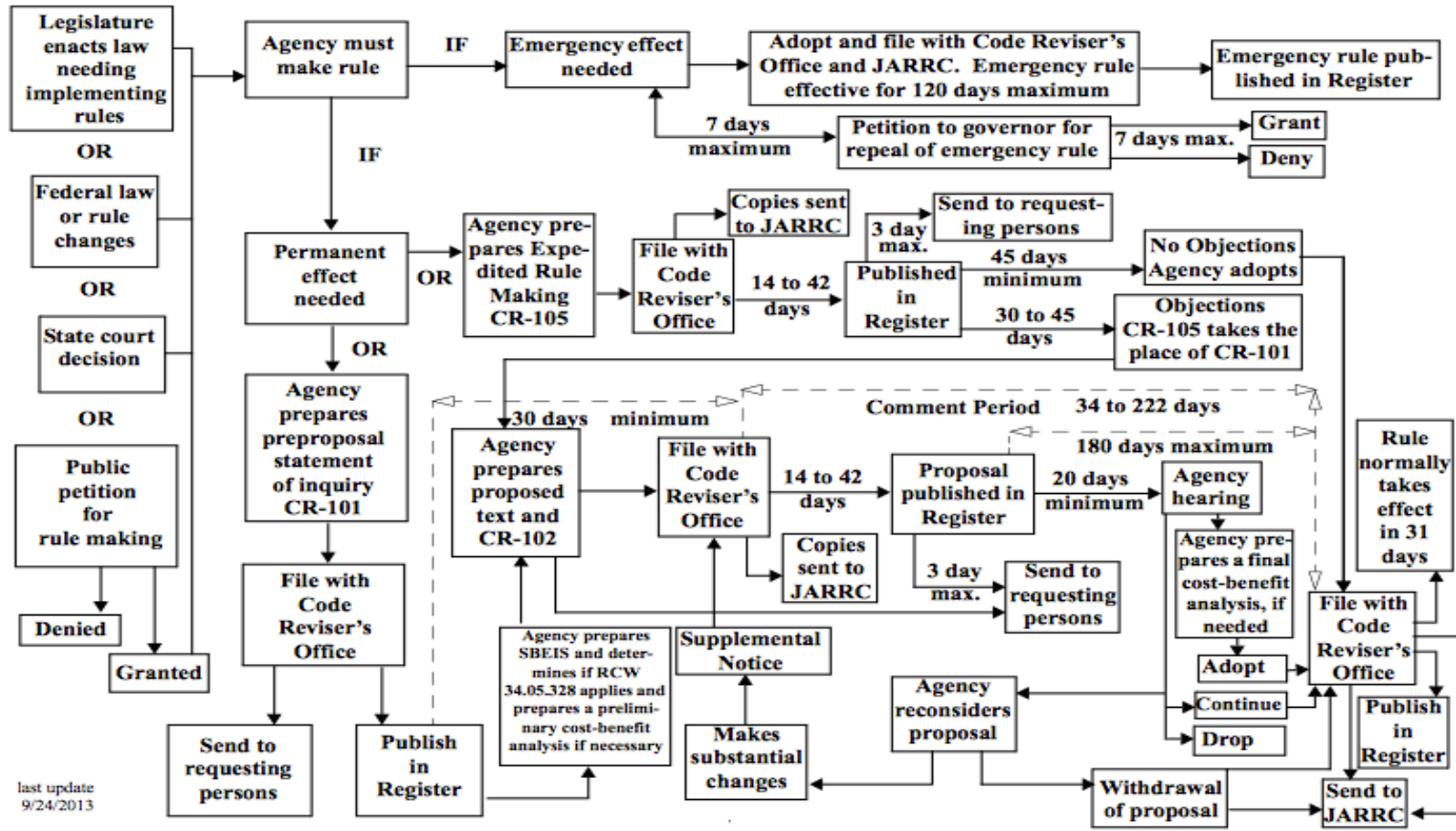
CENTRAL COORDINATING BODY –

Each Party should consider establishing and maintaining a national or central coordinating body able to:

- review proposed covered regulatory measures to determine the extent to which the development of such measures adheres to good regulatory practices
- strengthen consultation and coordination among domestic agencies to identify overlap and duplication and to prevent inconsistent requirements
- recommend systemic regulatory improvements

Regulations go in... But they don't come out!

- Despite a 90-day deadline, data from the first half of 2013 shows **two dozen OIRA regulatory reviews took longer than a year to complete**
- **Some 2013 reviews took nearly 2 years**
- **Worker silica exposure standard still not issued 40 years after warnings ... including two & a half years in OIRA**
- **Delayed or halted regulations include arsenic in drinking water & pesticides, formaldehyde**

Degree of Imbalanced Participation in Reviews with Meetings

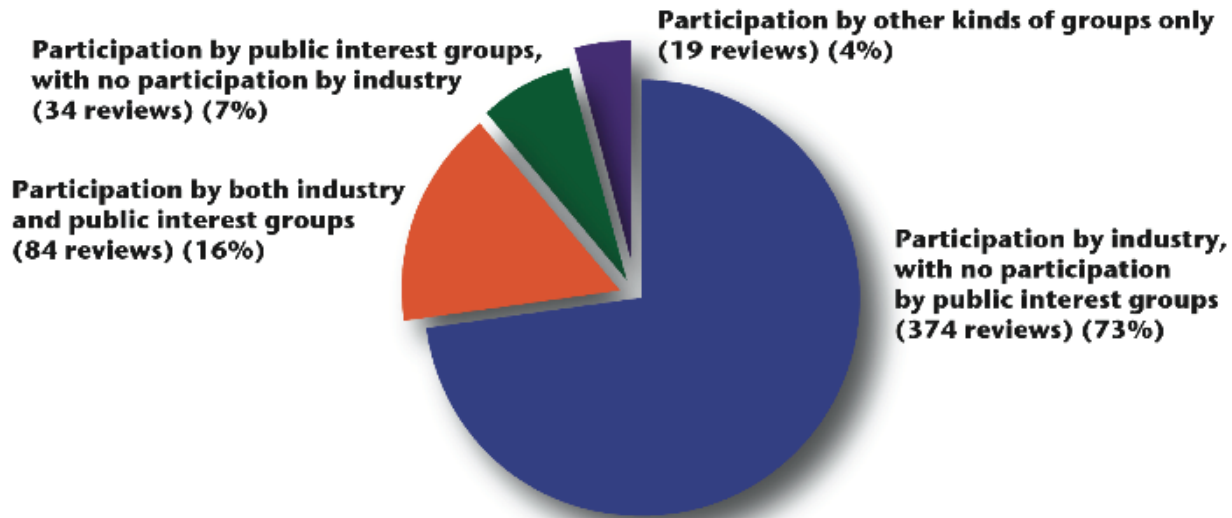

One-Way Downward Ratchet

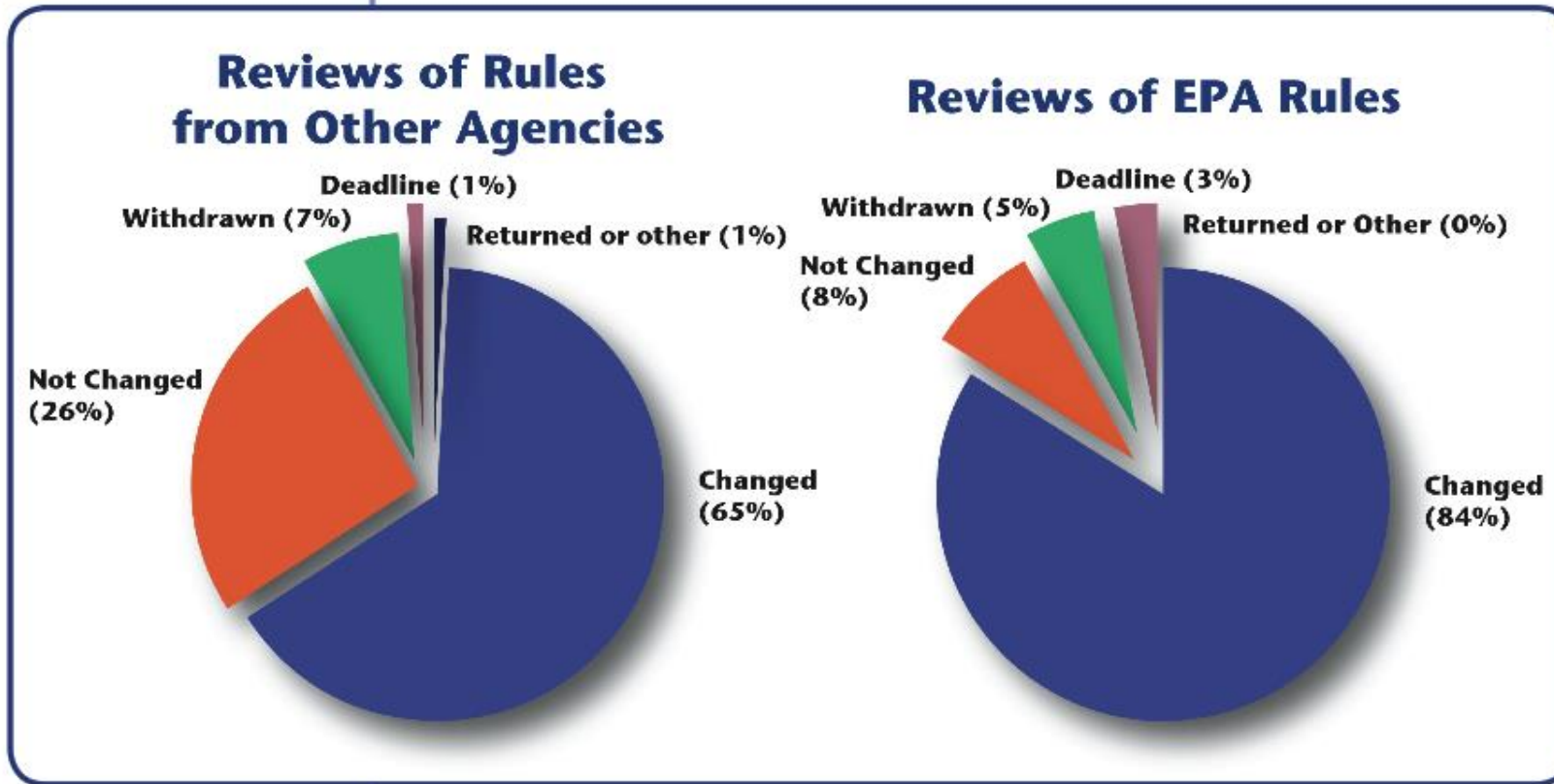

REGULATORY COOPERATION IN OTHER TPP CHAPTERS

- Federal trade officials must inform other countries of **state regulations** with a “significant impact” on trade
- Federal officials will and engage in “**technical exchanges**” concerning state regulations **with the goal of harmonizing** U.S. and other TPP countries’ standards
- No role for state regulators nor language supporting state laws that go beyond weak or missing federal standards on food, chemicals, and consumer product safety

TBT Rules: Labels, Special Rules Favoring Junk Foods

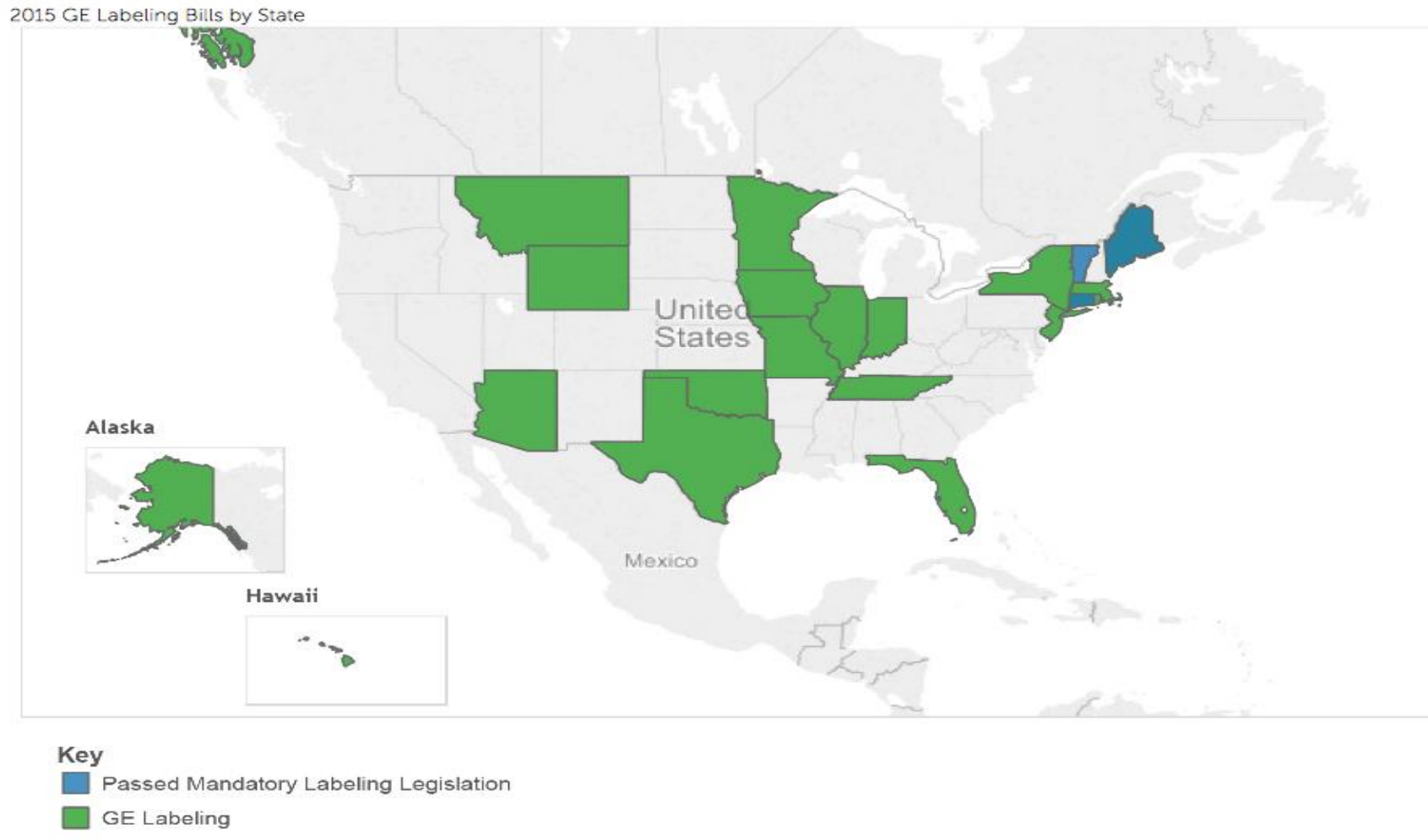
“Technical barriers to trade” generally: Emphasis on harmonizing, equivalency, “least trade restrictive,” and international (industry-developed) standards as preferred

- New annex on “Pre-Packaged Foods” may limit labeling additive ingredient details as “proprietary” formulas
- U.S. successfully pressured Chile last year to dumb-down nutritional warning labels, based on TBT rules in the WTO; **TPP is “WTO-plus”**
- WTO rules used to challenge Country of Origin Labeling for meat; Canada and Mexico now seeking over \$1 billion in trade sanctions, and Congress repealed COOL

At Risk: State Food Labels

- TPP seeks to reduce so-called “trade irritants” – including consumer and public health regulations
- Requiring labeling of GMO ingredients or sugary drink warning labels are considered “trade irritants”
- State food labeling laws vulnerable to challenge
- 300 food labeling bills introduced in 2014 and 2015
 - ✓ Nutrition and calorie disclosures
 - ✓ GMOs disclosure (enacted Vermont, Maine, Connecticut)
 - ✓ Warning labels on sugary drinks (proposed in California, New York, Vermont)
 - ✓ Identifying locally produced or harvested products including olive oil and seafood in dozens of states

Enacted & Proposed State GMO Labeling at Risk



While we're on the subject of GMOs... TPP promotes Biotech

- Provisions on “trade in products of modern biotechnology,” are located in market access and not in food safety chapter, so controversies over GMOs or synthetic biology will be judged based on market access criteria (encouraging access to markets) rather than risk assessments of safety for human health or the environment
- Provision encourages authorization of these products, and will be overseen by committee that lacks expertise in risk assessment and science.

Provisions in TPP Undermine Regulation of Toxics

- **“Least trade restrictive”** language in the technical barriers to trade (TBT) chapter applies to chemical policy
- **Cosmetics:** Annex 8-D on cosmetics includes language downplaying the risk to human health or safety from cosmetics, limiting required reassessments of the product’s safety in future, and encouraging only voluntary oversight

Downward Harmonization on Toxics

- These TPP provisions will strongly encourage downward harmonization of toxic chemicals regulation in U.S. states toward the low common denominator — namely, the federal Toxic Substances Control Act
- TSCA has been characterized by the President’s Cancer Panel as perhaps “the most egregious example of ineffective regulation of chemical contaminants”
- TPP could stymie congressional action to more effectively regulate chemicals associated with breast cancer, autism and infertility

At Risk: State & Federal Neonicotinoid Regulations

- Chemical companies like Syngenta and Bayer want to use TPP to stop future actions that would eliminate bee-killing pesticides
- The TPP could thwart US and global efforts to stop the use of bee-killing neonicotinoid (neonic) pesticides
- US states and localities have jumped into a void created by a lack of regulation at the federal level
- **Minnesota, California, Oregon & Vermont** are among the states that have already taken action.

At Risk: Fracking Regulations

The US government basically doesn't regulate. State laws are vulnerable to challenge; of course they are more "trade restrictive" than nonexistent federal standards.

- **Vermont** first state to ban fracking (2012)
- **Connecticut, California, Maryland & New York** have waste handling, disclosure, moratoria and other policies that go far beyond federal fracking regulations
- In 2015, there were 226 bills in 33 state legislatures concerning hydraulic fracturing

Summing up

- **US regulatory coherence is a deregulation agenda** - leading to delayed and weakened standards, less transparency, conflicts of interest & more industry influence
- **EU regulatory cooperation is also bad** – a top-down plan that will interfere with decisions of democratically elected legislators and halt evolving regulatory standards
- **Both agreements promote impact assessments**, harmonization and equivalency -- a certain pathway to a one-way downward ratchet that could result in setting federal and international minimum standards as the regulatory ceiling
- **Both agreements will increase corporate influence** and undermine democracy, including the system of federalism allowing US states to adopt more protective health, consumer, environmental and social standards

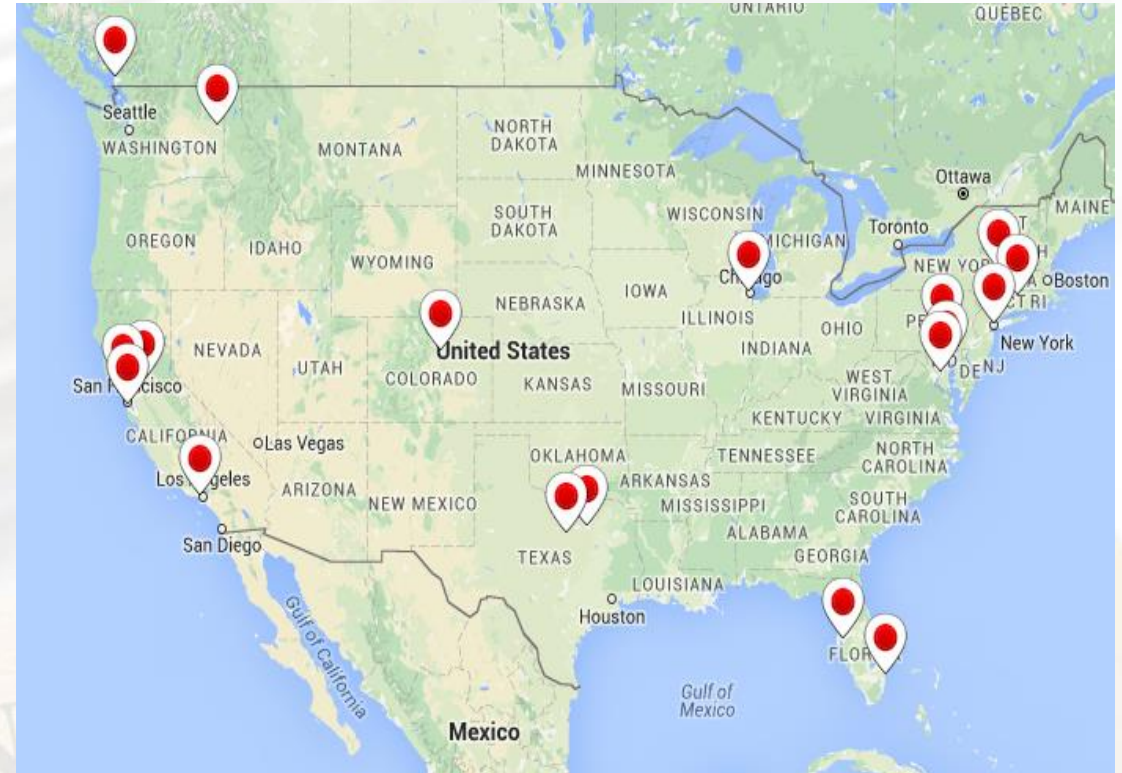
